Giving Thanks in Everything—A Tough Command Charles Stanley

- I. Introduction.
 - A. Text: I Thessalonians 5:15-18.
 - B. We are to rejoice always, giving thanks in everything in constant prayer.
 - C. Can a person really give thanks in everything?
- II. God wants every believer to give thanks in Him. (Psalm 92:1-2)
 - A. Thanksgiving was intended to be a way of life for every believer.
 - B. Whatever we are doing God intends for us to have a lifestyle of thanksgiving. (Psalm 147:1, 7, Psalm 100, Philippians 4, Philippians 1)
- III. There are limitations to giving thanks but not many.
 - A. The limitation of giving thanks to God is in sin, but we can thank God for the process He deals with us having sinned.
 - B. Giving thanks does not have to do with feelings but an act of the will.
- IV. The reason that God expects us to give thanks to God in everything is because of the powerful impact of this thanksgiving on every area of the Christian life.
 - A. It keeps us continually aware of God's presence.
 - B. It motivates us to look for God's purpose in an event.
 - C. It helps us to bring our will into submission to God's will.
 - D. It reminds us about our dependence upon God.
 - E. It helps us to develop a stronger trust in God.
 - F. It enables us to rejoice.
 - G. It focuses our attention upon God rather than our circumstances. (II Corinthians 5)
 - H. It energizes us.
 - I. It changes anxieties into peace. (Philippians 4)
- V. When we look for a quick way out, most of the time we are making a mistake.
