## Israel, the Key to Prophesy

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## I. Introduction.

- A. Israel is very small, but it has had a major impact on the world.
- B. Nevertheless, the world has marked the Jews as fugitives for ages.
- C. Israel is the keystone of prophesy.
- II. The promises of the Old Testament.
  - A. It was prophesied that Abraham and his seed would be given the land. (Genesis 13:14-15, 15:18, 17:8, 28, 35)
    - 1. No king of Israel ever occupied all of the Promised Land.
    - 2. The promise would have been fulfilled in Christ. (Galatians 3:16)
  - B. God promised that Israel would receive a king. (II Samuel 7, Psalm 89:3, Isaiah 9:6-7)
  - C. God promised prosperity in the land. (Amos 9:6-7)
  - D. God promised that warfare would end. (Isaiah 4)
  - E. God promised that nature would be released from the curse. (Isaiah 11, 35)
  - F. God promised spiritual renewal. (Isaiah 11:9)
- III. The fateful point in history when Jesus came and was rejected.
  - A. If the Jews had accepted Jesus as Messiah, they would have received the promises.
  - B. Their rejection opened up the way for the Gentles and postponed the fulfillment of the promises. (Matthew 3:1-2, 4:17, 10:5-7, 11:21, 21:33-43)
  - C. There is still a future for Israel, but in the current time, the Jews have been blinded because they have rejected Messiah. (Romans 11:25)
- IV. The prospect of the Jews.
  - A. God will fulfill all the promises to the Jews because He is no liar and He swore on His holiness. (Deuteronomy 24)
  - B. The Jews will see a great national revival when they return to Jesus. (Zechariah 12:10, Isaiah 53)
- V. Application.

- A. Although the Jews have rejected Jesus, there is no room for Anti-Semitism among God's people.
- B. The church will participate in all the blessings of Christ. (I Corinthians 6)
- C. We are in a late time in history marked by the return of Israel to the land as a nation.
