I. Introduction.

- A. Genghis Kahn was able to conquer the known world because he knew what it was like to impart vision, work as a team, trust his men, develop his men's strengths, get everybody involved and discipline.
- B. Military principles.
 - 1. The objective must be accomplished.
 - 2. The last command given supersedes all the others.
- II. The objective: the Great Commission.
 - A. Mark gives the scope of the Great Commission in Mark 16:15.
 - B. Luke gives the message of the Great Commission in 24:45: repentance (a change of mind and bearing fruit) and the remission of sins, which demands time in the Word of God. (Luke 13; Matthew 3:8; John 16; Ephesians 6:17; Hebrews 4:12)
 - C. John gives us the motivation for the Great Commission in John 20:21 to do the will of the Father. (Luke 19:10; Mark 10:45)
 - D. The power of the Great Commission is found in Acts 1:8 to be the Holy Spirit.
 - E. Matthew gives method of the Great Commission in 28:19-20: winning men to Christ and making disciples. Disciples are produced one by one. (2 Peter 3:9; 1 Timothy 2:4; Mark 3:13-15)
- III. We need good leaders. (1 Corinthians 11:1; Psalm 12:1)
- IV. We need to work as a team. (1 Corinthians 12:25)
- V. We need to trust our men. (John 13:1, 34-35)
- VI. We need to focus on our strengths and develop them. (1 Corinthians 12:11; Hebrews 2:4; Philippians 1:6; 1 Corinthians 12:18)
- VII. We need to know the book. (2 Timothy 3:17)
- VIII. We should not extend too far. (Matthew 6:33; Philippians 3:13)
- IX. We need to take care not to lose our vision.
 - A. Do not believe the Devil's lies such as the lie that says that all men do not need Jesus or want Jesus. (Mark 1:45; Ecclesiastes 3:11)

- B. Do not believe that you are not fit to share the gospel. (Romans 7:14; Philippians 3:3; John 6:63; 15:5; Isaiah 64:6)
- C. Believing there is no power in the gospel. (Romans 1:16; 8:9)
- D. Do not let the world influence you. (Romans 12:1-2; Jeremiah 15:19)
