B. He also set the pace for what he did.
C. We have to set the pace in our character and in what we do.
IV. A person must share his life. (I Thessalonians 2:7-8)
A. This has to do with firm affection for others. (Matthew 9:36)
B. Paul said he was willing to impart his own life for others.
V. God uses people who are doing their best to walk in Him. (Philippians 2:20-21)
