    - 1. Holiness describes a life cleansed from sin.
    - 2. This was why Jesus came and died for us.
  - B. Because holiness is turning away from sin and turning to Christ. (Titus 2:12)
  - C. Because the gospel teaches us to live a godly life.

III. What holiness is: a turning from sin and turning to God.

A. The grace of God is a whole suit of clothes. We did not receive Christ in such a way that we should go on sinning. (Ephesians 4:17)
