I. Introduction.

- A. Philosophy of life and ministry: to know, love and glorify God, be used of him to raise up qualified laborers as fast as possible to help fulfill the Great Commission.
- II. We should know God because it is his desire. (Habakkuk 1:13; Hosea 6:6; 1 Corinthians 1:9; Philippians 3:10; Psalm 27:4; Exodus 33:13; Amos 3:3; Psalm 119:55)
 - A. To know God we must be obedient. (John 14:21)
 - B. To know God is to please God. (Genesis 5:21-24; Hebrews 11:5)
 - C. To know God we must go through Jesus. (John 14:6; 3; 5:39)

III. We should love God.

- A. Jesus commanded it. (Matthew 22:34)
- B. Loving God is a matter of choice. The emotions are subject to the will. (Deuteronomy 30:19-20; 5:29)
- C. Loving God results in keeping his commandments. (John 14:15)
- D. Loving God is spending time with him.
- E. Loving God is loving other people. (Matthew 22)

IV. We should glorify God.

- A. We glorify God because it is the purpose for which we were created. (Isaiah 43:7; Revelation 4:11)
- B. We glorify God by praising him. (Psalm 50:23)
- C. We glorify God by bearing fruit. (John 15:8; Galatians 5:22-23)
- D. We glorify God by believing him.
- E. We glorify God by confessing Jesus as Lord. (Philippians 2:11)
- F. We glorify God more by what we are than what we do. (Ephesians 1:12)

V. To be used of him.

- A. Only God produces fruit. (Psalm 127:1; 1 Corinthians 3:6)
- B. To be used we must be fit to use by the Word of God. (2 Timothy 2:19; 3:17)

C. Christians should not adopt the retirement philosophy.

VI. To raise up.

- A. God sends forth laborers, and it is our object to pray. (Matthew 9)
- B. A laborer is trained and equipped to do what God wants him to do. (John 6:25)
- C. The Great Commission.
 - 1. Mark gives the scope of the Great Commission in Mark 16:15.
 - 2. Luke gives the message of the Great Commission in 24:45: repentance (a change of mind and bearing fruit) and the remission of sins, which demands time in the Word of God. (Luke 13; Matthew 3:8)
 - 3. John gives us the motivation for the Great Commission in John 20:21 to do the will of the Father
 - 4. The power of the Great Commission is found in Acts 1:8 to be the Holy Spirit.
 - 5. Matthew gives method of the Great Commission in 28:19-20: winning men to Christ and making disciples.
