D. What we are supposed to do has as much to do with what it looks like as where it came from. (John 3:6)

E. Whatever we look at as secular is spiritual if we are giving our lives to change that which is eternal.

A. God created us for his glory. (Isaiah 43:7)

B. God wants every believer to be complete in Christ. (Romans 8:29; Ephesians 4:13; John 15:8, 16; Luke 19:10; 1 John 4:17; John 20:21)

C. The pastor's job is to equip the laymen to do the ministry. (Ephesians 4:11)

A. Commitment.

1. We must realize that every day we are investing our lives.

2. Everybody serves someone in some way.

B. If we are going to invest our lives we should have a life worth investing. (Psalm 12:1; 2 Timothy 2:21; John 12:31)

C. To invest our lives....

1. We must be born again.

2. We should be growing in the grace and knowledge of Jesus. (Isaiah 37:31; John 14:23; Galatians 2:20; 1 Corinthians 6:19; Colossians 3:9-10; 2 Corinthians 3:18)

3. We must have a heart for people. (2 Peter 3:10; Luke 21:33)

4. We must be willing to pay the price. (Isaiah 43:4)

5. We must invest wisely. (1 Corinthians 4:2; Matthew 25)

D. We are hindered by.
