I. Introduction.

- A. We face many crisis in the world.

II. Position on the Word of God.

III. God has chosen to use people in the lives of people. (Isaiah 58:10)

- A. Take whoever God gives you. (John 6:44, 37)
- B. See that God's objective is many generations—this should be our objective as well. (1 Timothy 2:4; 2 Peter 3:9; Luke 19:10; John 20:21)

IV. Recognize that we need to be more like Jesus. (Romans 8:29; Ephesians 4:13; John 12:32; 1 John 1:9)

- A. Each person is of infinite value to God.
- B. Being exposed to the Son of God transforms us to be like him. (Exodus 33:13; Psalm 37:4; Philippians 3:10; 2 Corinthians 3:18; Hebrews 11:6; Matthew 6:30)

V. We are responsible for our stewardship regarding money, the gospel, our gifts, our time, our spiritual pilgrimage. (2 Corinthians 6:20; 1 Corinthians 4:7; Psalm 139; Deuteronomy 8:18; Ecclesiastes 5:10-11; Psalm 75:6-7; 90:12; 2 Peter 3:18; 1:2-3, 15-16)

- A. The life attracts. (2 Timothy 2)
 - 1. We need to be fit for the Master to use.
 - 2. God will use us to feed a hungry world if we are pure.
- B. The life recruits. (Matthew 9:9)
- C. The life impacts. (Revelation 14:13; Luke 21:33; 2 Peter 3:10)
- D. The life trains. (1 Corinthians 11:1; Philippians 1; Romans 8:28)

VI. To maintain your walk with Christ..

- A. Feed consistently on the Word of God.
- B. Maintain fellowship with God and with other believers.
- C. Be accountable to God and with someone else.
- D. Be men and women of God's vision. (1 Corinthians 9:22)
