Prayer: Warfare of a Christian Jerry Bridges

I. Introduction.

- A. It is an awesome responsibility to speak the words of God. (1 Peter 4)
- B. Text: 2 Kings 3.
- C. It is important to take root downward in order to bear fruit upward. (Isaiah 37:31)
 - 1. Prayer is the practical expression of our trusting God. (Jeremiah 17)
 - 2. Prayer is a participation in the gospel. (Philippians 1:3-5)
- D. Prayer is the warfare of the Christian.
- II. Christians tend to only pray for felt needs, but God wants us to pray for the objective too.
- III. Terms used in warfare.
 - A. Strategy. This has to do with the ultimate objective.
 - B. Tactics. This is employing resources in concert with the objective.
 - C. Logistics. This has to do with the procurement and replacement of resources.
- IV. Prayer and warfare.
 - A. Most of us are only concerned with logistics.
 - B. God's strategy is to deliver people from the kingdom of darkness. (Acts 28:16)
 - 1. God wants this to happen everywhere. (Matthew 28:18-20; Revelation 5:9-10; 7:9)
 - 2. God wants these people who are delivered to be disciples.
 - 3. God ultimately wants the whole body of Christ to be conformed to the image of Jesus. (Romans 8:29; Ephesians 4:12-16)
 - C. Tactics include evangelism, discipling, character training and building up the body.
 - D. The logistics are the physical things including care, building up, restoring the wounded and physical needs.
 - E. Believers need to pray for God's strategy and tactics, not only logistical needs.
 - 1. *Operation World* can help us to pray for nations across the world.
 - 2. You might select a nation to pray for a day.

- 3. You might pray for your children to be conformed to Jesus' likeness.
- F. A strategic prayer: Colossians 1:9.
 - 1. You cannot check off most prayers.

2. Some prayers are point in time such as Romans 15, but most prayers must be both strategic and continual.

- G. Our logistic prayers should involve things such as giving.
- H. The logistical, tactical and strategic prayers are all important.
