- A. Text: 2 Peter 1.
- B. There is good news for us.

II. God through his divine power has given us all we need for life and godliness. (2 Peter 1:3-4)

III. All is made available through knowledge of Jesus Christ as savior. Eternal life is a personal relationship with Jesus Christ. (John 17:3)

IV. We have been made partakers of the divine nature.

- A. Through union with Jesus, we have become partakers of his nature. (John 15)
- B. The objective truth is that we are in Christ when we receive him.
- C. The subjective truth is that we must abide in him. We must experience and count on the union.
 - 1. There is a renunciation of self-reliance.
 - 2. There is an appropriation of the gift of eternal life.

V. Ways Christians try to live the Christian life.

- A. By our own will power and discipline.
- B. By passively assuming God is going to do everything through us.
- C. By partial dependence upon God and partial dependence upon ourselves.
- D. By abiding in Jesus Christ—the biblical approach. (John 15:5)
 - 1. We need God's complete enablement not his sometimes help.
 - 2. There will be work and growth in this, but it is enabled by God.
 - 3. The good that comes out of this is that we learn we cannot do anything without Christ.
