- A. It is uncertain, it is deceitful, and it is fleeting. (1 Timothy6:17-19, Matthew 13:22, Proverbs 23:5
- B. Where to invest: in tithing, (tithing is not looked at negatively in the New Testament), to those in want, and to our teachers. (Malachi 3, 1 Corinthians 16:2, 2 Corinthians 8:14, Galatians 6:6)
- C. Some teach that all the money is to be given to the church, but the speaker believes the Spirit holds the individual responsible for giving.
- D. We work with our hands and support the weak, buy and sell, and trade. (1 Thessalonians 4:11-12, Acts 20:34-35, Ephesians 4:28, Matthew 25:9, James 4:13, Luke 19:15)
- V. Attitude: we are to give cheerfully and willingly. (2 Corinthians 8:12, 9:6-7)
 - A. Too many of us have succumbed to the world system. (Philippians 4:11)
 - B. Lust and greed hinders us—if God has not provided, He has not provided.
 - C. Perhaps God wants you to do without.
 - D. The ability to do all things in Christ is on the heels of being able to do without.
