- A. Irresponsible use of time.

 - 2. Time in ministry may suffer.
 - 3. Don't be on a constant date!
- B. Irresponsible use of money.
- C. Irresponsible physical relationship.
 - 1. Would I have behaved the some way had Jesus been sitting in the car?
 - 2. God's is always present. (Hebrews 4:13, Psalm 139:23)
- D. Standards of purity should be determined by God's Word and nothing else.
 - 1. Don't date non-believers.
 - 2. Don't date to witness. (2 Corinthians 6:14)
 - 3. Don't date the stagnant Christian. (1 Corinthians 3:3)
- E. Don't let dating interfere with your personal walk with God.
- F. Don't do anything in your dating life that is not glorifying to God.
 - 1. Immorality (Genesis 39:9-12, 2 Timothy 2:22, 1 Thessalonians 4:13)
 - 2. Defrauding stirring up desires which you cannot righteously satisfy (If you can't cook, don't turn the fire on)
- IV. Trust God concerning your future partner
 - A. Be willing to be single if God chooses.

B. Delay marriage if God chooses.

C. Only marry when convinced this is God's will for your life. (Psalm 84:11, 34:10, Lamentations 3:22, 23)

D. God will lead you to the right person.
