- B. None of these things are wrong, but if you give your life to getting them you will never be happy or content. (Ecclesiastes 5:10, 1 Timothy 6:9-10)
- C. Demas was on Paul's first team, but he gave it all up for the love of the world. The world passes away it is too unstable.
- II. We can count on God, His Word and the souls of people.
 - A. The story of the big catch. (Luke 5)
 - 1. Faith needs no precedent.
 - 2. The disciples forsook all and followed Jesus.
 - B. The story of the conversion of Saul of Tarsus. (Acts 9)
 - 1. Saul had to make a decision between the comforts of the world and the call of Christ. (Philippians 3:7-8)
 - 2. Saul forsook all and followed Christ.
 - C. The story of the rich young ruler. (Mark 10)
 - 1. The rich young ruler was given the same option as Peter to forsake all and follow Jesus.
 - 2. However he was sad and chose to go with riches.
 - D. Do not give your life to a smoldering ash because one day all your riches will burn.
 - E. Give your life to people, God and the Word of God.

 - 2. You can have this.
 - 3. Teach people and not lessons.

 - A. Reaching out with the message of Jesus Christ to have others come into the joy of the Lord. (Romans 1)

- 1. Paul was set apart for the gospel of God.
- 2. He knew this because Jesus told Paul that he would be a witness. (Acts, Romans 1:1)
- 3. The last thing Jesus told his apostles is that he would make them a witness.
- 4. God wants to make us witnesses for Christ because this is vital for making disciples.
- 5. The first revelation about Jesus in Revelation is that He is a faithful witness. (Revelation 1:5)
- 6. Ask the Lord to help you become a faithful witness to Christ.
- 7. Of all the things that Jesus could have told the people, He told them to repent because man needs salvation.
- 8. The message of life must be gotten out to those who are dying (Mark 1:14-15, 1 Thessalonians 2:4)
- B. When people respond we help them so that they can be an effective witness.
