## I. Introduction.

- A. Text: Romans 8.
- B. Romans 8 is the Spirit's chapter.
- C. The theme of the chapter is that the believer is not condemned.
- D. There is no condemnation because of the work of the Holy Spirit.
- E. There are things that the Spirit does to confirm that there is no condemnation.
- II. He frees from sin and death. God frees us forensically.
- III. He enables us to fulfill the law.
  - A. God gives us the fruit of the Spirit.
  - B. We are redeemed to do good works.
  - C. True believers are known by their obedience. (Luke 1:72, Hebrews 5:8)
- IV. He changes our nature.
  - A. The thinking process is changed—believers are after different things.
  - B. We are after the Spirit. Our disposition is changed.
  - C. People who are after the flesh have a disposition towards earthly things. This is spiritual isolation from God. (1 John 2; Philippians 2:5; 3:19; 1 Corinthians 2; Isaiah 59:2)
  - D. The result of redemption is life and peace.
  - E. Flesh cannot serve God because the fleshly mind is set against God.
  - F. We can now please God since we are no longer bound to the flesh.
  - G. Believers now have a spiritual resurrection and will one day have a physical resurrection.
- V. He empowers us for victory.
- VI. He confirms our adoption.
- VII. He guarantees our glory.
- VIII. He aids our prayers.
