I. Introduction.

- A. Text: Revelation 1.
- B. Christ is alive in his church and he searches with a penetrating gaze.
- C. We are the church that Christ has built.
- D. Internal systems in the church are life principles/spiritual attitudes that must be cultivated in God's people.

II. Dependence.

- A. This is the attitude of insufficiency.
- B. This can be lost when one is successful through a program. (Psalm 19)
- C. This sense of sufficiency results in driving towards God. (John 14)

III. Flexibility.

- A. We need to be able to change.
- B. This is important so that God can be allowed to do different things.
- C. The church needs to be flexible as well as the individual. (Acts 16)

IV. The desire to grow. (1 Peter 2:2)

- A. We grow by feeding on the Word of God.
- B. We are not learning to know doctrine—we are learning to know God.

V. Faithfulness.

- A. The church needs more "marathon runners."
- B. The mark of character is enduring commitment. (2 Timothy 4:6)

VI. Hope.

- A. This means security for the future. (Romans 12:12)
- B. We look forward to eternity and a redeemed body. (Romans 8)
- C. This means that we should not too much to the present times. (Matthew 16:21)
- D. Living for eternity will change present behavior. (1 John 3:3)
