 - a. If there is a problem on your heart of sin, confess it to God and men. (1 John)
 - b. We are to keep short accounts.
 - c. The only thing necessary to work together is love.
- D. We all make a choice Mary chose to hunger after Jesus which was better than Martha chose.

1. We are not to judge according to the sight of our eyes. (John 7:24, Isaiah 11:2, 1 Samuel 16:7)

2. The city of Sodom was advanced, but it was a city of idols.

3. Sodom is a picture of sin - we look towards it, move towards it, and move into it.

4. Abraham was set apart by his righteousness - God expects a man of God. (Genesis 18:19)

5. Lot lost his family with the city. (2 Peter 2:8)

6. We reap what we sew. (Galatians 6:7-8, Job 4:8)

E. To end well you must start off well and remain that way.

1. Life is not easy. (John 21)

2. We want to go out in a blaze of glory.
