- B. We should work after God's precepts. (James 1:22; Psalm 123:4)
- II. Why we should obey the Word of God.
 - A. God commanded it. (Joshua 1:8; Matthew 7:24-27; Ezekiel 33:31-32)
 - 1. He has absolute authority as the author of the universe.
 - 2. God's commandments are good. (1 John 5:3; Galatians 5:19-23; Romans 7:12)
 - B. God loves us. (Romans 12:1)
 - C. We love God, which is proved by obedience. (John 14:21; Luke 6:46)
 - D. God is worthy of our obedience. (Revelation 4:11; 5:12)
- III. How we should obey the Word of God.
 - A. We have to know his commandments in the Scripture. (John 14:21; James 1:25)
 - 1. Look intently. (Proverbs 2:1-3, 9-12; 2 Timothy 3:16)
 - a. We must look to the Scriptures in prayerful dependence.
 - b. We will then come to know the Lord and know what is right.
 - 2. Do not forget.
 - a. Memorization is one method that works.
 - b. The Spirit of God can bring it to mind when we know it.
 - c. We are to think about it and reflect on it. (Joshua 1:8)
 - 3. Do it. (2 Timothy 3:16)
 - a. Scripture is profitable for teaching.
 - b. Scripture is profitable for reproof.
 - c. Scripture is profitable for correction.
 - d. Scripture is profitable for training.
 - B. We must obey by the power of God's Spirit. (Philippians 2:12-13)
