I. Introduction.

- A. Text: 2 Corinthians 3.
- B. We are letters of recommendation by the Spirit.

II. Responsibility.

- A. God has a responsibility in salvation.
 - 1. The Spirit of God gives life.
 - 2. The glory of God shown on Moses face, but the believer's glory will be greater. (Exodus 34:29)
 - 3. The consequence of the unfading glory of the believer is boldness in preaching.
- B. We have a responsibility. Beholding the glory of the Lord, we are changed.
 - 1. We have liberty, but what is more important is the inner liberty of Spirit that comes from being guilt free before the Lord.
 - 2. We are being daily renewed by God. (2 Corinthians 4)
 - 3. We are not to worry about little things. (Ephesians 3:16)
 - 4. To be purified we are to live by the Word of God. (Psalm 119:116, 119:118, 119:32, 119:89, 119:97-98, 119:148, 119:155, 119:164-165)
 - 5. The Word of God helps in meditation, evangelism and peace.
 - 6. We get life through the Scriptures and need a practical form of intake.
 - 7. The speaker meets with men for Scripture memory.
 - 8. Power comes from the Spirit of God but it takes work. (John 6:63, Ephesians 6)
 - 9. Find a man to follow and be willing to put off any sin. (Isaiah 41:15, Song of Solomon 3:8)
 - 10. We are to get to know Him and put Him first. (2 Corinthians 3)
