I. Introduction.

- A. God is looking for men and women He knows He can use.
- II. The Lord is looking for people whom He can live His life out in. (Galatians 2:20)
 - A. Jesus Christ is the only one who can live out the Christian life.
 - B. We accomplish this through the mystery of Christ living in us. (Colossians 1:27)
 - C. We are born again by the Spirit when we accept Christ. (John 3)
 - 1. We have all our inheritance in Him when we are born again.
 - 2. The born again need to grow. (1 Peter 2:2-3)
 - 3. Jesus increased in balance all of his life. (Luke 2:52)
 - D. We are to grow in balance all of our life.
 - E. As we grow we want to keep Jesus the center of our life.




- F. From Christ comes our power. (1 Corinthians 1:24, 2:4)
 - 1. You are complete in Jesus Christ.
 - 2. All you need is in Him.
 - 3. Christ is the head. (Colossians 2:9-10)

- G. Jesus takes our burden. (Matthew 11:28-29)
 - 1. He is under the load with us.
 - 2. Our lot in life is to serve and suffer, but He knows and furnishes all our burdens.
 - 3. We have to deal with Christ's relationship to ourselves and not others.

III. The Word of God.

- A. The Word gives us instruction and tells us about Jesus. (Psalm 119:105, 130)
- B. Jesus is the perfect expression of God and the Bible is the perfect written expression of it. (Revelation 19:13)
- C. The Word teaches us how to pray. (John 15:7, Proverbs 28:9)
- D. The Word leads to obedience. (John 14:21)
- E. The Word gives us a story and tells us how to witness. (Acts 4:12, Jeremiah 23:28, 1 Peter 4:11)



- IV. All the elements of our spiritual life must be in balance to keep our life in balance. (Mark 1:35, Psalm 5:3, Daniel 6:10)
 - A. Prayer must be consistent.
 - B. Obedience must be to the Lord. (2 Chronicles 25:2, Proverbs 23:26, Isaiah 25:20-21)
 - C. One of the most important things for obedience is to say things as they are and not make excuses.
 - D. Obedience requires preparation of the heart. (Ezra 7:10, John 13:17)

- E. We walk in the Spirit in order to not fulfill the desires of the flesh, but many get this backwards. (Galatians 5:16)
 - 1. It is not what you "do not do" that makes you spiritual, but it is what you do.
 - 2. If the Christian is obedient, witnessing be a natural byproduct.
