I. Bearing Fruit

- A. People want to bear fruit for Jesus and go out to share ands bring in a harvest.
 - 1. When nothing happens they get discouraged.
 - 2. They ask "What's wrong?"
- B. They forget that bearing fruit for Jesus is contingent on receiving the blessing of Jesus.
 - 1. Blessing enables us.
 - 2. Blessing empowers us.
- II. Spiritual Victory: Faith.
 - A. Israel needed faith when they faced Pharaoh.
 - 1. God knows what He is going to do.
 - 2. He just does not inform us ahead of time.
 - 3. Walking by sight is unreliable.
 - 4. The word of God is more sure than sight.
- III. Spiritual Victory: Duty.
 - A. God taught Moses about the duty of leadership. (Exodus 18:13)
 - 1. Moses was involved in the daily affairs of his people though they nearly stoned him. (Exodus 17:4)
 - 2. Though others fail us we must not fail them.
 - 3. Jethro questioned Moses' tactic of judging the people.
 - 4. Moses could have distained Jethro's advice because of his recent victory, but he humbled himself.
 - 5. A wise man will increase in learning and Jethro taught him to delegate.
 - a. Moses was to pray for the people.
 - b. Moses was to teach the people.

- c. Moses was to show the people how to walk before God.
 - 1) If you have responsibilities in church pray for your people.
 - 2) If you have responsibilities in church teach the people.
 - 3) If you have responsibilities in church show them how to walk.
- d. Moses was to pick able men to judge lesser cases.
- B. God taught Moses about duty in leadership because He is the one who graciously and mercifully delivered Israel out of Egypt, giving him authority over Israel.
 - 1. God forbids idolatry.
 - a. There are no other Gods.
 - b. Idolatry is loving things more than we love God.
 - c. God does not want first pace in our lives; He wants all of our lives.
 - 2. God forbids serving images.
 - a. Walking in victory means doing what's right out of love and not duty.
 - b. Dennis the Menace makes a mess in order to make a valentine card for his mother, but he does it because he lovers her.
 - c. We desire to serve God and what we do out of love and appreciation is accepted by God.
 - 3. God forbids taking his name in vain.
 - a. God shines in our hearts to give light and glory of knowledge of Jesus Christ. (2 Corinthians 4:6)
 - b. Out of gratitude we should honor the name of God.
 - 4. God commands Israel to keep holy the Sabbath day.
 - a. If we set a side time for God we will be more productive than otherwise.
 - b. If Israel would turn from dishonoring the Sabbath but keep it according to God's will then Israel would prosper. (Isaiah 58:13-14)
 - 5. God commands honoring fathers and mothers.
 - a. The key is to take parents into our lives by sharing the little things.
 - b. People enjoy getting into our lives. (1 Peter 3:7)
 - c. What wives wish husbands were doing includes helping them by opening doors, remembering birthdays, etc. (Ephesians 5:33)

- 6. God forbids murder.
 - a. Life is sacred.
 - b. There are other ways to destroy a life than physical killing.
- 7. God forbids adultery.
 - a. Purity of life is crucial. (Galatians 5:16)
 - b. Planes fly because of upward wind lift, and if we move in the Spirit there will be enough lift to keep us from sin.
 - 1) When was the last time you were bothered by lust while praying with someone to receive Christ?
 - 2) God says move in the Spirit and we will not be led by the flesh.
- 8. God forbids stealing.
 - a. Be careful in doing taxes.
 - b. During a conference I bought a soda in a machine that returned my nickel and the Spirit convicted me it was not my money.
 - c. I returned the nickel to the storeowner and he marveled that I was honest.
 - d. The truth is I wanted that nickel.
- 9. God forbids bearing false witness against neighbors.
 - a. Saying something to belittle others is not good.
 - b. Watch what you say about people.
- 10. God forbids covetousness.
 - b. Covetousness is accusing God of mismanagement, believing we deserve more than we have.
 - b. Men of truth hate covetousness.
 - 1) A survey was taken asking, "Do you think you are generous?"
 - 2) Most people said they are not generous. (Proverbs 3:27)
 - 3) Covetousness, extravagance and ignorance are enemies of generosity. (Luke 6:38)
 - 4) Material things corrupt so God limits how much he can trust us with.
 - 5) If we become generous God will increase the flow of material things through us.
