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- I. Introduction.
- II. The Great Commission is spoken of five times in the Bible always to eleven men.
 - A. Matthew 28:19-20 speaks to the quality of the ministry. The Great Commission is not about making converts—it is about discipleship. It takes a disciple to make one.
 - B. Mark 16:15 gives the quantitative aspect of it.
 - C. Matthew 24:45-47 gives the content of the message—repentance and forgiveness.
 - D. John 20:20-21 hints at the cost of the Great Commission.
 - 1. Jesus always meets us at our point of need, and He gave them peace.
 - 2. He has only promised that He will not leave us—not a rose garden.
 - E. Acts 1:8-9 tells the progress of it begins where you are.
- III. Is accomplishing the Great Commission possible? The issue is not ability but willingness. (Acts 2:1, I Samuel 2:35)
 - A. John 3:16 is on God's heart, but how do we accomplish what is on His mind?
 - B. We reach a man by warning a man and then by teaching him in all wisdom. This process is then repeated for mass multiplication. (Colossians 1:28-29, II Timothy 2:2)
- IV. The marks of discipleship.
 - A. Love. (John 14:34-35)
 - B. Continuing in the Word. (John 8:31)
 - C. Loving not the world. (I John 2:15-16)
 - D. Denying oneself. (Luke 9:23)
 - E. It is really living as Jesus did.
- V. Why give oneself to the Commission?
 - A. Because Jesus said to.
 - B. Because the world desperately needs Jesus—we take for granted what Jesus did for our sins.

- 1. There is a person who can bring our needs—God meets our needs for peace in everything. (John 14:21, Isaiah 26:3, Romans 5:1)
- 2. To change society, we must change people and that requires the gospel.
- 3. When we get the Man right—we get the world right. (II Corinthians 5:17)
- 4. People know about God, but the gospel is a stranger in this world, and this is where we come in. (Romans 1)
- 5. Whatever it takes is not too much so long as we understand the world as it is.
- C. You will not be bored with the Great Commission.

VI. It does not take much of a man to be a Christian—it takes all of him. The commitment must be to become a disciple-maker.
