## Spiritual Victory - Part 7 LeRoy Eims

- I. Two commands were given to Joshua before he was commissioned to take the land.
  - A. Joshua was commanded to meditate on the word. (Joshua 1:8)
    - 1. In spite of his busy preparations God commanded him to meditate.
    - 2. This is the first time God commanded man to get instructions from a book.
    - 3. Thinking on God's book affects his thinking, granting him success.
      - a. Men who meditate on the word prosper. (Psalm 1:1-3; 1 Timothy 4:15)
      - b. The promises that go with God's commands are so staggering we can't believe them.
      - c. Yet God means what He says.
      - d. Success in mentioned only once in the Bible, in relation to meditation.
    - 4. What does it mean to meditate on God's word?
      - a. A man took us on a tour of London, running us quickly through many sites.
      - b. He moved so quickly we missed London.
      - c. A second man took us on a slow tour of London and we really saw the city.
      - d. We cannot sprint through the Scriptures; we must read slowly.
      - e. The promises are given to those who will meditate.
        - 1) Choose a book of the Bible and take a note book and pen.
        - 2) Pray for God to teach you from His word. (Psalm 119:18)
        - 3) Then read slowly, thoughtfully, prayerfully.
        - 4) Jot down what God says to you.
        - 5) Pray and ask the Lord's help to apply what you have heard.
        - 6) This process is communion with God.
  - B. Joshua was commanded to remove his sandals for the Lord is holy. (Josh 5:13-14)

- 1. Jesus Christ is mentioned with reference to conflict. (Genesis 3:15; 1 John 3:8; Hebrews 2:10; Isaiah 55)
- 2. Paul also asked what the Lord wanted him to do. (Acts 9:6)
- 3. Joshua finally went into battle. (Josh 6:1-3)
  - a. In the first battle Joshua was told to stand and see the Lord fight for him.
  - b. In the second battle with Amalek he fought.
  - c. In this third battle God promised to give him the city of Jericho.
    - 1) The priests go ahead with the ark in the middle and the people after.
    - 2) The Lord must take the central position in all our work.
    - 3) If God is not central we are off balance.
    - 4) The devil wants us to be off balance.
  - d. The people shouted after they circled the city seven days and the walls fell down flat, giving Israel great victory. (Joshua 6:20)
  - e. But Achan sinned by taking of the accursed things. (Joshua 7:1)
    - 1) When Joshua went after Ai they were defeated.
    - 2) Achan coveted the gold and garments of the Babylonians.
      - a) He saw it.
      - b) He coveted it.
      - c) He took it.
      - d) He hid it.
      - e) This was in disobedience to God's command.
  - f. Joshua went to God where he learned he could not wage holy war with unholy people. (Joshua 7:6)
    - 1) The unholy cannot stand among the people of God. (Proverbs 28:13)
    - 2) The Navigators today are better trained today than before but we lack a hunger for holiness.
    - 3) Moses was to find men who hate covetousness to lead Israel. (Exodus 18:21)

- 4) Jesus taught that His kingdom is not of this world.
- 5) John taught us to not love the world.
- 6) Achan was trying to take the consecrated things for himself.
- 7) We have work budgets and personal needs budget, and to take out of the work budget for personal needs is similar to what Achan did.
- 8) Our bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit and we should glorify God with them.
- g. Joshua received new instructions from God to defeat Ai. (Joshua 8:4-7)
  - 1) They were to ambush the enemy, there is no magic formula.
  - 2) This time the spoil was for the people.
  - 3) The Lord God delivered Ai into the hands of Israel.
- h. Joshua renewed the covenant. (Joshua 8:30-35)
  - 1) Joshua built an altar to God and wrote out the Law.
  - 2) He did not pursue the enemy but honored God.
  - 3) They honored God because Moses commanded them to do it after God had given them the land. (Deuteronomy 11:29-30; 27:2-3)
  - 4) The new possession of wealth could cause them to forget God.
- II. New Testament application of Joshua's victory concerns money.
  - A. The love of money brings temptation. (1 Timothy 6:9)
    - 1. Demas had fallen in love with the world.
    - 2. Those who are rich should not trust in riches. (1 Timothy 6:17)
  - B. Money is not the issue but the love of it.
    - 1. Many Christians have wealth but wealth does not have them.
    - 2. After Ai Israel suddenly became rich so they needed to refocus on the word of God.
