## Spiritual Victory - Part 8 LeRoy Eims

I. We learned that the devil is a dirty fighter.

- II. Today we will learn more about the enemies of God's people
  - A. The enemies of God will unite to fight against God's people. (Joshua 9:1-3)
    - 1. We also learn that the devil is wily. (Ephesians 6:11)
    - 2. They tricked Joshua, who didn't ask God about the Gibeonites. (Joshua 9:14)
  - B. There are three weapons to fight the devil with.
    - 1. The Word. (Matthew 4:4)
    - 2. Faith. (1 John 5:4-5)
    - 3. Dependence on God. (Proverbs 3:5-6)
  - C. The devil is sneaky.
    - 1. The serpent was more crafty than all the beasts of the field. (Genesis 3:1)
    - 2. He says there is no penalty for sin.
    - 3. He says the Word of God cannot be trusted.
    - 4. He says God does not really love you.
  - D. The devil makes three promises.
    - 1. Wisdom.
    - 2. Union with God.
    - 3. The good life.
  - E. The devil is active today.

1. He is active through cults that offer more to God's people, more than what God promises.

- 2. Cults advertise secret knowledge or light.
- 3. Cults masquerade as angels of light. (Genesis 3)
- F. In the battle, time was running out. (Joshua 10:5)

- 1. God told Joshua he would win the battle but it was getting dark.
- 2. Joshua must have begun to wonder how they would win this battle.
  - a. Do you suppose anyone would have thought of having the sun stand still?
  - b. Yet this is exactly what Joshua did.
  - c. When was the last time you got before God and asked for a miracle?

1) God is a miracle making God.

- 2) Joshua knew this of God.
- d. God is interested in all aspects of our lives and work. (2 Kings 6:1-7)
  - 1) We just do not think in terms of miracles but of human experience.
  - 2) But in spiritual warfare we must think from God's standpoint.
- e. Joshua commanded the sun to stand still and it did. (Joshua 10:14)

G. In another battle the enemies again united against God's people. (Joshua 11:1-5)

1. Mortal enemies unite as friends if it means fighting against God. (Luke 23:12)

- 2. God told Joshua to not fear the multitude arrayed against him.
- 3. The Lord delivered him from these enemies.
- 4. Courage is essential in fighting but it is courage in God who fights for. (Psalm 44:3)

5. David's mighty man Dodo the Ahohite smote many Philistines, as did Shammah the Hararite. (2 Samuel 23:10)

- a. Two applications from this aspect of battle.
  - 1) These men were associated with David the warrior. (1 Chronicles 20:4)
    - a) After David many giant killers arose in Israel.
    - b) They gained courage from David.
    - c) Only disciples make disciples. (Matthew 28:16)

2) Only God wins these spiritual battles that make men.

- H. Last battles are the toughest to fight.
  - 1. Joshua cut of the Anakim. (Joshua 11:21)

- 2. Anakim were strong inhabitants of Canaan. (Numbers 23:28)
- 3. These were the final enemies Israel needed to defeat.
- 4. Old age is a final battle that many of God's people fight.
- 5. God fights for his people no matter what the battle is. (Joshua 23:3; Exodus 15:3; Psalm 20:4; Revelation 19)
- 6. The Lord made the nations flee from Joshua. (Joshua 23:9)
- III. In light of the fact that God wins all our battles we need to see something about our witness for Christ.
  - A. Keys for witnessing:
    - 1. The key for witnessing for Christ is not getting my dialogue straight.
    - 2. The key is to live under the blessing of God.
  - B. There are two basic principles to effective witnessing.
    - 1. God does it, not man. (Acts 2:47)
    - 2. God uses us. (Acts 10:1)
      - a. God does not use angels to proclaim the Gospel.
      - b. God uses people to proclaim the Gospel.
      - c. Draw a heart with a cross at the top. On the bottom write a "P" and a "D" somewhere else. Now write Romans 15:18.
      - d. The shortest distance between two points is a straight line.
      - f. But God does not make a straight line between him and the sinner; he goes through Paul, or some other saint.
      - g. I draw with the nearest pen to my hand, and God uses the nearest saint to him who is available and ready to share.
        - 1) Paul's main responsibility was vertical—his relationship with God.
          - a) People who are too busy for God are useless.
          - b) All horizontal activity ignores God, who saves.
          - c) Don't get so involved in working for God that you have no time for God.
          - d) God is the only one who wins victories.

2) Every witness for God needs to maintain his/her relationship with God.

- C. We need to be courageous. (Joshua 23:6)
  - 1. If we have God with us we can be courageous.
  - 2. To have courage is the first command God gave to Joshua. (Joshua 1:7)
    - a. Joshua is a man on track with God.
    - b. Get on God's track and stay there.
      - 1) Some get into disciple making for a while and than get off track.
      - 2) We need to stay on track.
      - 3) Once in the battle we should not turn back. (Hebrews 11:33)
