How to make an impact on an area for Christ:

I. Examples

- A. Life of Ahaz (2 Chronicles 28:1ff)
 - 1. Did evil in the sight of the Lord.
 - 2. Extremely low time in history of Jewish nation.
- B. Life of Hezekiah (2 Chronicles 28:29ff)
 - 1. Did right in the sight of the Lord.
 - 2. Begin with your own life: prayer, the Word of God, offerings, worship, praise, rejoicing
 - 3. Sought God with all his heart.

II. Principles

- A. Whole-hearted. (2 Chronicles 31:21)
 - 1. God wants men who are eager zealots.
 - 2. General attitude:
 - a) Take it easy.
 - b) Don't work too hard.
 - 3. Spirit of the word of God is to hit it wholeheartedly!
 - 4. God wants men with hearts on fire because only fire kindles fire.
 - 5. Have a heart that is burdened on fire whole-hearted. (2 Kings 2:2-4)
 - 6. Play a man's game with high stakes play a boy's game and you'll requite boys; play a man's game and you will requite men.

B. Single-minded
