- I. The greatest unresolved problem facing the contemporary church in the unemployment problem.
 - A. There are two groups of people in your church the pillars who support it and the caterpillars who crawl in and out each week.
 - B. It is inconceivable that God would call the church into existence and that the church should languish for lack of leadership.
 - 1. God gives gifts to men and gifted men to the church.
 - 2. God gives gifts, but we do not develop gifts.
- II. Two basic steps in the process of making disciples.
 - A. Your first task in making disciples is to determine what you want to develop.
 - 1. Objectives always determine outcome.
 - 2. Have in mind where you are going.
 - 3. Aristotle said that we stand a much better chance of hitting a target if we can see it.
 - B. Your second task in making disciples is to develop what you have determined.
 - 1. The first deals with product and the second deals with the process.
- III. What we ought to be developing in the realm of making disciples
 - A. What are you looking for in your disciples?
 - 1. I am looking for a committed individual.
 - a) Unreserved commitment to Jesus Christ
 - b) Unreserved commitment to the body of Jesus Christ
 - c) Unreserved commitment to the ministry of God in the world
 - 2. I am looking for a competent individual.
 - a) A person who knows something fully
 - b) A person who feels something deeply

- c) A person who does something consistently
- 3. I am looking for a person who is creative.
 - a) You cannot develop a person without giving to that individual a sphere of freedom.
 - b) That individual has a personality and spiritual gifts with which to function in the body.
 - c) I want someone who can think, dream and believe God.
- 4. You can't find these kinds of people, but you can develop them.
- IV. How did Jesus Christ go about developing such distinctiveness in His disciples?
 - A. Jesus Christ developed his disciples by example.
 - 1. They observed Him in all situations
 - 2. If what they see in your life is incompatible with what you are telling them you really do not communicate.
 - 3. They will be like their teacher after they are fully trained. (Luke 6:40)
 - 4. Disciples disciple the way they were discipled. (Matthew 20:20-28; John 13:13;

Philippians 4:9)

- 5. Make sure you share your failures with your disciples.
- B. Jesus Christ developed His disciples by problems.
 - 1. Christian education is too passive; we produce too many spectators.
 - 2. People who are involved make better teachers.
 - 3. Jesus knew you can't teach faith by lecture so he puts them in the laboratory.

(Mark 4:1-34)

- 4. What are you doing to develop the faith of your disciples?
- 5. Our problem is that we are winning in the church, but losing like crazy outside.
- 6. Two things people need for growth, food and exercise. Keep them in balance.
 - a) Food Spiritual obesity
 - b) Exercise Spiritual anemia

- 7. Disciple makers get excited about what their disciples are doing.
- C. Jesus discipled his men by love.
 - 1. Love one another as I have loved you. (John 13:34)
 - 2. I desire that they may be with me. (John 17:24)
 - 3. I came not to be ministered to, but to minister. (Mark 10:45)
 - 4. A lover is a leader.
 - 6. You cannot put a front on in the realm of love.
- D. Jesus discipled his men by faith
 - 1. Training involves trusting.
 - 2. The secret of making disciples is developing an incurable confidence in the Spirit's ability to change a person.
 - 3. Study your disciples to find where they are and what they need.
 - 4. Communicate your confidence in the Lord working in their lives.
 - 5. Inferiority feelings are the worst problems that we have in the evangelical church.
 - 6. Ask God to give you discernment to see way beyond where the person is now.
