## Part 4

I. In our series thus far we have sought answered two crucial questions:

- A. What is a disciple?
  - 1. He is a learner.
  - 2. He is a follower
  - 3. He is a reproducer
  - 4. What he is, determines what he does.
- B. What is our Biblical authority to build disciples?
  - 1. Making disciples is not an option it is essential.
    - a) Our Lord commanded His disciples to make disciples. (Matthew 28:16-20)
    - b) The Apostle Paul commanded Timothy to make disciples. (2 Timothy 2)
  - 2. We have a Biblical mandate and we also have Biblical model.
    - a) Your disciples will do what you do.
    - b) The Biblical model is to experience the pattern before learning the process.
- II. New Testament model for making disciples.
  - A. New Testament discipleship flourishes in the midst of a hostile environment. (Acts 8-9)

1. The church learning the law of spiritual thermodynamics; the greater the heat the greater the expansion.

- 2. Saul loved God, but hated Jesus and thought he was doing God a favor.
- 3. After his conversion, Saul came to Jerusalem to join with the Apostles, but couldn't.
- 4. Humanly speaking Barnabas is the only reason Saul ever got into the church.
- 5. The early days in a person's life physically and spiritually are very determinative.

a) Follow up is not nice - it is a necessity.

6. Barnabas brought Saul to Antioch so that they could disciple the believers and so that

Barnabas could train Saul to replace him. (Acts 11:19)

- a) Travel with people to disciple them; more is caught than taught.
- b) What is the point of going around town if you don't take someone with you?
- 7. What are you doing to prepare your disciples to suffer? (Acts 14:19)

a) It is very possible that there will come a day here in America where we will pay a price for our identification with Christ.

b) The Christian life does not depend on environment - it depends on relationship with Jesus Christ.

8. Problems will always be a part of the Christian Life. (Acts 15:35)

a) Barnabas wanted to take John Mark, Paul did not (Acts 13:13)

- b) Barnabas and Paul had a strong argument and parted ways.
- c) When Paul was about to die, he asked Timothy to bring John Mark because

Barnabas picked him up and gave him a second chance.

1) God always uses imperfect instruments.

- 9. Paul finds Aquilla and Pricilla and hooks up with them. (Acts 18)
  - a) Couples should be discipling other couples.
  - b) They got together because they were of the same trade.

c) Did it ever occur to you why God gave you that trade or put you in that neighborhood?

- d) Paul brought them to Ephesus and then left them there to minister.
- e) Aquilla and Pricilla began to disciple Apollos following Paul's example.

  - A. God will use many individuals to build into a life of a believer.
    - 1. God used my mother, who couldn't pass an elementary theology test.
    - 2. God used my father, who was not a Christian.
    - 3. God used my professors.
    - 4. God used my Sunday school teacher, Walt.
