

Questions and Answers – Part 2

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I. Introduction.

II. To find healthy Christian fellowship find a church where the Bible is preached and then look around. One may find a group from the Navigators too.

III. Tell a person without any need to move along and then tell them if they have a need in the future they should consider Jesus.

IV. Find out if a doubting person is saved first and then give them the spiritual contract of receiving Jesus. (Revelation 3:20)

V. We know the Bible was written by God because the Bible stands higher criticism alone and it works. Everybody has an authority that they must put themselves under.

VI. No man knows when Jesus is going to come back.

VII. We are responsible to address those in sin. (Proverbs 28:23; Leviticus 19:17)

VIII. A man and wife should not have their quiet time together, but they should share what is happening there.

IX. Christians should not seek a mate who is a nonbeliever. They should get to know a person before dating. Do not marry someone who does not turn you on. (2 Corinthians 6:14; Luke 2:52)

X. God does not lead one member of the family into missions without others in the family. God is not in the business of breaking up the family. (Psalm 37:34)

XI. Working on an area of your life is not in the flesh: we cannot correct an area of our lives, but we can submit to God's changing power. (Colossians 2:9-10; Ephesians 5:18; Galatians 5:22-23; 3:3; Luke 9:23; Romans 8:13)

XII. The Bible does not teach a competitive Spirit. (1 Corinthians 4:7; 1:29; 12:18, 25)

XIII. A person's spirituality does not depend on his discipline but the fruit of the Spirit. The motive is Christ's love. (Galatians 5:22-23; 2 Corinthians 5:14; Proverbs 5:23; Job 36:5)

XIV. The fact that others do not believe the Bible does not stop it from being the Bible. (Ephesians 6:15)

XV. Based upon the Scripture, we have a responsibility to obey the laws of the land. There is no basis for the lawlessness of some peace demonstrations. There is a difference between killing and murder. (Romans 13:1-2; 1 Samuel 14:15; Malachi 3:6; Exodus 15:21-22; Leviticus 20)

XVI. There are certain things God will not do for you, such as repentance and prayer. God will provide you with power when you repent from sin.

XVII. Sharing the Word, praying and sharing experiences will be profitable in fellowship.

XVII. Christians returning home from college should stay with the basics and look for someone they can fellowship with.

XIX. It is good to have honesty before a couple is married, but sins need to be told without details.

XX. Children should honor their parents so that their relationships with God are not blocked. (Hebrews 12:15)

XXI. The most important trait to look for in a mate to ensure that he will be walking with God later on is faithfulness. (Luke 16)

XXII. Some accept Christ earlier and later because of grace. (1 Timothy 2:4)
