A. Some think the answer is money.
B. Some think the answer is philosophy. (Colossians 2:8, Revelation 22:18)
C. God's Word lights the path. (Psalm 119:19, 105)
D. These people must be told they are on the wrong road. (Ecclesiastes 3:5)
III. There are some who are on the wrong road and know it.
A. These people know they are on dangerous ground. (Romans 1)
B. We want to teach men about Christ all the time. (Colossians 1:28)
IV. There are some on the right road but are detouring and do not know it. The solution is exposure to people's lives who are different. (Galatians 3:10; 1 Timothy 1:5)
V. There are some on the right road but are detouring and know it.
VI. There are some on the right road on the center line.
