 - 4. Through prayer, invite Jesus to come in and control your life.

 - A. Confirm the commitment by asking if the person is coming to receive Jesus Christ as Lord.
 - B. Give assurance of salvation.
 - C. Help with rededication and restoration to God's fellowship. (1 John 1:7, 9; Matthew 6:33; Luke 6:46; John 13:13; Romans 8:32)
