- A. Text: Luke 9.
- B. Background.

- II. Responses to the call of Jesus.

 - 2. His quick response seems at first to be a good choice.
 - 3. Did the man really know where Jesus would go? He was going into hostility, betrayal and death. The man did not consider the path of Jesus.
 - 4. The path of Jesus is not about what one has. Christ puts "a new man in that suit of clothes" in contrast to a new suit on a man.
 - 5. Christ may not take care of the burdens off our back, but He can take care of the burdens off our hearts.
 - B. Mr. Too Slow.
 - 1. This call was probably different one into vocational ministry.
 - 2. He wanted to bury his father first.
 - 3. The problem: "me first" and "Lord" do not go together. Christ must come first.

C. Mr. Half-Hearted.

- 1. Part of his heart was still back home, but Christ demanded the whole thing.
- 2. You cannot do a good job if you are half hearted and retreat conscious.
- 3. Christ wants our whole-hearted commitment right where we are at.
