- I. Introduction.
 - A. Text: Hebrews 11.
 - B. The why, what, how and how long of faith.

II. Why?

- A. We all want to be believed. A lack of belief is an insult to God.
- B. We are saved by grace through faith. (Ephesians 2:8-9)
 - 1. Grace saves us.
 - 2. The medium grace saves us through is faith.
 - 3. Grace is undeserved help from God.
 - 4. All go astray in some area and are in need of grace. (Psalm 119)
 - 5. Faith takes what grace offers.
 - 6. Salvation to the end is always by grace and through faith.

III. What?

- A. Biblical faith has a foundation of facts—that Jesus is Lord.
- B. Faith is an inner assurance that counts on God and obeys Him.
 - 1. This rests on objective facts and subjective experience. (Hebrews 11:6)
 - 2. We are all born with an intuitive sense that God exists.
 - a. We know through our senses, reason, authority (revelation) and through intuition—all are valid ways of knowing. Under the fourth God has planted in our hearts that He exists.
 - b. No one knows enough to be a genuine atheist, for there is too much one does not know.
 - 3. God has revealed Himself generally and specially.
 - a. General revelation has to do with the universe and seeing ourselves.
 - b. Special revelation has to do with the Scriptures and God's Son Jesus Christ.

- c. God has not left Himself without a witness.
- 4. There is a subjective experience in responding to God. (John 7:17)
 - a. We must do first and then we will know.
 - b. God is not in the business of satisfying curiosity seekers.
 - c. The willingness to do must become before the revelation of the act. The essential problem we have is the will. We obey our way to faith.

IV. How?

- A. The Word of God. (Romans 10:17)
 - 1. The example of a man who believed the word of Jesus and went his way. (John 4)
 - 2. Faith obeys. (Proverbs 3:5-6)
- B. A good conscience before God and man. (Acts 24:16)
 - 1. A good conscience is an inner freedom of spirit.
 - 2. For faith to grow and develop, a clean conscience is necessary.
- C. A thankful heart. (Romans 1:21)
 - 1. You give God thanks, and He will give you joy increasing your faith. (Ephesians 5:20)
 - 2. We give thanks for the good times but also need to be thankful for the tough times that grow our faith.
 - 3. God is often most real when things are tough. Never doubt in the light what God showed you in the dark.
