- A. We are to be holy because God, the source of joy, is holy. (1 Peter 1:15-16; John 10)
- B. God is a spirit, infinite, eternal and unchangeable in his being, wisdom, power, holiness, justice, goodness and truth.
- II. In Scripture God magnifies his holiness. (Revelation 4; Isaiah 6; 1 John 1:5)
 - A. Holiness is conformity to the moral character of God.
 - B. Our purpose is to be holy before God. (Ephesians 1:4)
 - C. The world's morality is getting worse all the time and the Christian's holiness is often one step behind.
- III. Implications of our call to be holy like God.
 - A. We must take all sin seriously, even little sins. God hates sin. (Habakkuk 1:13; Zechariah 8:17; Proverbs 6:16-19; Ephesians 4:30; 1 John 2:1-2)
 - B. We cannot pursue holiness in our own self-effort. Holiness must be a work of God. (2 Corinthians 3:18)
 - C. God has given us certain responsibilities: we must put to death the deeds of the body. (Romans 8:13; Philippians 2:12-13)
