## I. Introduction.

- A. Text: 1 Peter 1:15-16.
- B. Happy are those who seek to be holy. Jesus Christ came that we might have Life. (Matthew
- 5:6; John 10:10)
- C. Of all his attributes, he chooses to magnify his holiness in a special way. (Revelation 4; Isaiah
- 6:1-3)
- D. There is no imperfection in God's holiness.
- II. God chose us to be holy and blameless in his sight. (Ephesians 4)
  - A. We are far short of perfection.
  - B. But God wants us to be making progress towards perfection.
  - C. We are to put off the characteristics of our old selves. (Ephesians 4:24)
  - D. God expects holiness in every area of our lives. (1 Peter 1:15-16; Philippians 3:12-15)
- III. Implications on the expectation to be holy because God is holy.
  - A. We must take sin seriously. God utterly abhors sin.
    - 1. God credits holiness to us by faith. He sees us in Christ as perfectly holy.
    - 2. God sees us as his children who need to grow up and be conformed to his image also, so he disciplines us.
  - B. We cannot pursue this standard of holiness by our sheer will power. (2 Corinthians 3:18)
  - C. God provides for our holiness. (Philippians 2:12-13)
    - 1. We cannot give spiritual life to ourselves or anyone else.
    - 2. We do certain things because we know that God provides life.
