I. Introduction.

- IV. Discipline. This is integrating your life—your activities.
  - A. The big decision is followed by many little decisions.
  - B. Because you love someone you try to understand that person.
  - C. Discipline is channeled by choices consistently.
  - D. A disciplined life is focused.
  - E. You say no to this and yes to Christ.
  - F. What is God asking you to stop to make room for what He wants you to start?

## V. Devotion. This personalizes your relationship.

- A. This is about being a follower of a wonderful Person—Jesus Christ.
- B. We are not living with an image—this personal relationship warms everything up.
