II. Abraham and Lot.

- A. Both were righteous men. (Genesis 15:6, 2 Peter 2:8)
- B. Lot shows that we are to beware of riches. (1 Timothy 6:10, Philippians 4)

1. Pride is a root of this. (Proverbs 13:10)

2. God is no respecter of persons - Lot and Abraham were righteous, but riches got to one of them. (Galatians 6:7-9, Colossians 3:25, Jeremiah 7:4)

- C. Abraham kept short accounts. Abraham took initiative. (Proverbs 22:3)
- D. Love. (Psalm 133:1, Matthew 7:12, Luke 10:42)
 - 1. We only need to be brothers to get along.
 - 2. Do unto others as you would have them do unto you.

E. Abraham gave Lot his choice of land because he trusted God to provide for him. (Hebrews 11:3, Exodus 14:13-14, Luke 15:20, John 12:24)

F. Lot judged by sight. (Isaiah 11:3, John 7:24, 1 Samuel 16:7, Proverbs 14:12, 16:2, 11:14, Isaiah 53:6, Matthew 7:13)

1. There was not enough righteous people in Sodom to save it. (Genesis 18:19, James 2:25, Genesis 14:14, Genesis 14:22)

2. Lot unwisely made a decision with his eyes and was not able to win against such sin.

G. Lot rejoiced more in the promises of man than the promises of God.

1. How is it that someone can be righteous like Lot but still go down the path of destruction? Explain.

2. Why is judging only by the sight of the eyes so dangerous?

3. What is the main characteristic that Abraham showed that Lot did not? How can you cultivate this same characteristic in your own life?
