Joseph John Crawford

- I. Introduction The overarching principle to Joseph's life is that the way up is down.
- II. There are five "P"s to Joseph's life.
 - A. Perennial home. (Genesis 39)
 - 1. Joseph had some trouble with his brothers.
 - 2. Joseph was trapped by his brothers.

B. Pit.

- 1. God used unusual means to prepare Joseph.
- 2. It is unlikely that he saw himself as a savior when he was in the pit.
- 3. The only way out of the pit was up. Joseph learned that salvation comes from above.

C. Potifer.

- 1. Potifer bought Joseph from slavery and whatever Joseph did prospered. (Genesis 39:33)
- 2. Potifer's wife tempted Joseph, and he fled youthful lust. She blamed Joseph though.

D. Prison.

- 1. God was with Joseph in prison. (2 Chronicles 16:9)
- 2. Joseph was prosperous in making God first. (Joshua 1:8, Philippians 1:13, Philippians 4:22)

E. Pharaoh.

- 1. Joseph interpreted Pharaoh's dreams and was put in a high position.
- 2. Joseph through his sons became the head of two tribes.
- 3. The way up is down.
- III. Everything happened to Joseph because what men meant for evil God used for good. (Genesis 50:20)
