Introduction:

- A. We have previously determined that the purpose of Proverbs was to build Christian character.
- B. And we looked at God's plan to accomplish the purpose of building Christian character.
- C. Now we want to consider the power source for accomplishing God's plan.
 - 1. God rules by his own power. (Psalm 66:7)
 - 2. God is our deliverer and strength. (Psalm 18:2, 32)
 - 3. God created the earth by the power of his word. (Genesis 1)
 - 4. All Scripture is given by inspiration and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction and for training in righteousness. (2 Timothy 3:16)
- D. There are three aspects of Bible study.
 - 1. Attitude for correct Bible study.
 - 2. Correct approach to Bible study.
 - 3. The awards of correct Bible study.
 - a. We need to seek God in his word. (Proverbs 2:3)
 - b. Prayer.
 - 1. Father we thank you for your strength.
 - 2. Show us how to communicate spiritual truth.
 - 3. The Holy Spirit is the teacher of truth.
 - 4. Let you r word prepare the hearts of men.
 - 5. We pray for Jesus' sake.
- I. Correct Bible study includes an attitude of application.
 - A. God gave us the word for one reason, to change lives, not to increase our knowledge. (1 Corinthians 8:1)
 - 1. We need to receive the word of God. (Proverbs 2)

- 2. We need the attitude of submission in order to benefit from Bible study. (Proverbs 3:1)
- 3. When God got my attention he gave me a thirst for his word.
- 4. I studied the word of God night after night but my attitude needed to be oriented toward application.
- 5. The word is life and health to those who find it. (Proverbs 4:20-21)
- 6. The word of God is able to build us up if our attitude is one of application. (Acts 20:32)
- 7. Attitude needs to be one of application. (Proverbs 5:1; 20:21-23; 7:1-3; 12:27; 28:19; 28:20-22)
- B. What is your attitude toward Bible study?
 - 1. Is your attitude one of application or one of curiosity?
 - 2. The wise man or woman will have the attitude of application.
- II. The correct approach to Bible study is necessary.
 - A. Personal investigation is essential to Christian character.
 - 1. Personal investigation means that each believer searches the word to see what it means.
 - 2. We go to commentaries only after personal study.
 - 3. Commentaries are good but initially we need to study by personal investigation.
 - 4. Commentaries are other men's thoughts about the book.
 - B. Hard work is also important.
 - 1. Lack of hard work explains why people go to commentaries first.
 - 2. It's easier to read other men's ideas than it is to study yourself.
 - a. If we incline our hearts to wisdom and cry after knowledge we will find.
 - b. This implies action on our part.
 - c. I have meditated on single verse for years. (John 15:5)
 - 3. We need to avoid laziness, taking a lesson from the ant. (Proverbs 6:6)
 - 4. The one that works his land will eat. (Proverbs 12:11)
 - 5. The place of the sluggard is wasted. (Proverbs 20:24)

- 7. If we are going to grow in Christian character we need to have the word of God as our power source to change our lives.
- 8. We need to commit ourselves to the master of the book. (Proverbs 24:13-14
- III. Awards follow correct Bible study.
 - A. The fear of God is a reward of Bible study so that God blesses and preserves the faithful. (Proverbs 2:5)
 - 1. God gives life and health. (Proverbs 4:22)
 - 2. We learn digression and knowledge. (Proverbs 5:2)
 - 3. We gain reproof and instruction for life. (Proverbs 6:23)
 - 4. Wisdom can be ours. (Proverbs 18:4)
 - 5. Do you know men characterized by these qualities?
 - 6. These qualities can be ours if our walk is one of application, personal investigation and hard work.
 - 7. We will also have the testimony of being wise men that hear God instead of sluggards.
 - a. Hearing the word of truth in order to apply God's truth. (Matthew 13:13)
 - 1. A wise man will hear and gain understanding. (Proverbs 1:5)
 - 2. A wise man will hear and learn while a fool hates instruction. (Proverbs 1:7)
 - 3. Hear and be wise. (Proverbs 8:33)
 - 4. A wise hears and heeds but a fool ignores instruction. (Proverbs 13:1)
 - b. A wise man will also have right perspective.
 - 1. Diligence needs to characterize our lives. (Proverbs 10:5)
 - 2. Wise lay up knowledge but the fool ignores instruction. (Proverbs 10:14)
 - c. We will be able to accept reproof and learn form it. (Proverbs 9:8)
 - 1. Shallow men refuse instruction while the wise accept instruction.
 - 2. After coming on staff with the Navigators I had promised to bring a crib to a conference for a man's baby and was rebuked for it.
 - a. Rebukes are good for us.

- b. Open rebuke is better than secret love.
- 3. Poor men refuse to hear rebuke.
- 4. How do you take rebuke? Pride leads to bitterness.
- B. The wise fear God. (Proverbs 14:16)
 - 1. While in business I got into a religious discussion with a man in a barber shop.
 - 2. A wealthy Latin American man said that God would never punish him because he would buy his way out of hell with his money.
 - 3. Confidence in money or strength or wisdom is foolishness; our confidence must be in God.
 - 4. The king's favor is toward the wise servant but his wrath is toward fools. (Proverbs 14:35)
 - 5. We choose what way we will travel; the way of God's wisdom or the way of man's wisdom. (Proverbs 1)
 - a. As believers in Chris we need to hearken unto the Lord.
 - b. This is God's desire for each one of us.
