- A. We each have a particular race to run and there is a common denominator for all of us.
- B. Why is it difficult to discern what our race is?
 - 1. For some it is more natural to think in terms of career.
 - 2. God is thinking in terms of character.
- C. Happiness is the byproduct, not the product. (Hebrews 1:9)
 - 1. God is concerned about character.
 - 2. Character is determined by choices. (Isaiah 7:15)
 - a. Choices involve conflict because we have enemies: the world, the flesh and the Devil. Much is "against" us. (Ephesians 6:12)
