## What the Church Was Meant to Be – Part 5 John MacArthur

I. The church exists to glorify God.

- A. The church does this through the leadership of godly elders.
  - 1. Elders must be holy.
  - 2. Elders must hold out the word of God.
- B. In addition to aiming at the glory of God elders must be committed to discipleship.
  - 1. Spiritual maturity is a goal of the church that the saints might do the work of ministry. (Ephesians 4)
  - 2. This is a long range process. (2 Timothy 2:2)
  - 3. Pastors must disciple others.
  - 4. I am a fifth generation pastor.
    - a. I received a legacy from my father.
    - b. I must pass this on to others.
    - c. When my father was dying of cancer I once asked him if there was anything he wanted and he said he wanted to preach one more sermon.
    - d. My grandfather passed on the desire to preach to my father and he to me.
  - 5. Once when I ran a relay race each man ran his best until the third man stopped for no reason.
    - a. He thought only about himself.
    - b. We each need to pass the baton on to others.
    - c. We talk of the finished work of Christ but do we think of the unfinished work?
    - d. Our church is committed to discipleship.
- C. A church must also be marked by people involved in ministry.
  - 1. This requires active volunteers.
  - 2. Each person needs to know his or her spiritual gifts and use them.

- 3. Every man receives a gift that is a unique combination of gifts. (1 Peter 4:10; 1 Corinthians 12)
- 4. A church must be committed to people and promote those ministering well.
- D. A church also needs a spirit of genuine fellowship.
  - 1. There ought to be loving fellowship in the church.
  - 2. We have all experienced aggression and lack of love in our churches.
  - 3. We need to love one another.
  - 4. A regular celebration of the Lord's Table is helpful here.
  - 5. Fellowship is not just coffee and donuts in the fellowship hall.
    - a. Fellowship is caring for one another.
    - b. Confessing to one another. (James 5:16)
    - c. Forgiving one another. (Colossians 3:13)
    - d. Bearing one another's burdens. (Galatians 6:2)
    - e. Rebuking one another. (Titus 1)
    - f. Comforting one another. (1 Thessalonians 4:18)
    - g. Stimulating one another to good works. (Hebrews 10:25)
    - h. Edifying one another. (Romans 14:19)
    - i. Admonishing one another. (Romans 15:14)
    - j. Praying for one another. (James 5:16)
    - k. Loving one another. (1 John 4:11)
    - 1. Being kind to one another. (Ephesians 4:32)
  - 6. A church needs to hold one another accountable. (Matthew 18)
  - 7. Playing church is not right.
- E. The church needs to be marked by strong evangelistic outreach.
  - 1. The corporate testimony of the church in the community is vital.
  - 2. Our testimony needs to be backed up by good work in the life of the church.

- 3. Gene Getz says that individuals make the corporate testimony viable.
- 4. People attend church because how it looks.
  - a. We need to care for our buildings.
  - b. This demonstrates caring.
- 5. People asto attend church because of good parking.
- 6. People also come to church because of a caring nursery.
- 7. People come to church fourthly because of the pastor.
- 8. We offer baptism services where people give testimony and this impacts others.
- 9. Church members must be built up to reach out to others.
- F. The church must focus on the family.
  - 1. We need to be a source of strength for the family.
  - 2. I did a series on the role of women in the family and the ERA picketed us.
  - 3. Our attendance skyrocketed.
  - 4. We teach the fathers how to be family priests.
  - 5. We have a program for engaged couples.
- G. The church needs to be willing to change.
  - 1. Seven Last Words of the Church: We've never done it that way before is deadly.
  - 2. One church has a Christmas Eve service but no one ever goes.
  - 3. Jesus told the Pharisees they substituted men's traditions for the ways of God. (Matthew 15)
  - 4. We've changed with the growth God has sent to us.
  - 5. We don't even print an order of service because we want t surprise people.
  - 6. In the future we man change even more.
  - 7. Some people resist change so don't build the church around them.
- H. A church must be marked by great faith.
  - 1. Complaining about lack of money speaks of little faith.

- 2. We took on a missionary with little money but God gave us more money and we supported more missionaries.
- 3. We built our sanctuary debt free.
- 4. Some people have a grasshopper complex, feeling little in the sight of problems.
- 5. We need to exercise wisdom as well a spirit of sacrifice.
- 6. The Macedonians gave out of their poverty.
- I. A church must focus on worship.
  - 1. In many cases we have lost the meaning of worship, emphasizing the practical aspect of ministry.
  - 2. Many services today have no worship, preoccupied with their programs.
  - 3. Many churches are preoccupied with their theology.
    - a. Some focus on the Holy Spirit.
    - b. Some focus on salvations.

## II. Questions.

- A. What is worship?
  - 1. Worship is a focus on God to exalt him.
  - 2. Obedience is the purest worship.
  - 3. Teaching is a stimulus for worship.
  - 4. Good preaching is the heart of worship.
  - 5. Expression of praise and thanksgiving is also worship.
  - 6. Silent reverence of God is also worship.
  - 7. The soul needs to meditate on the presence of God.
- B. How do you regulate your services?
  - 1. We have changed according to the growth of the congregation.
  - 2. We have fellowship groups, graded by age.
  - 3. Our flocks met on Friday nights, which are regulated by geography.
  - 4. On Sunday nights we teach through books of the Bible.

- 5. A church is like a smorgasbord, people plug in where they like.
  - a. We have a seminary.
  - b. We have a missions training program.
  - c. We have a Foundations of the Faith program.
  - d. We have a semi-pro baseball team.
  - e. We have bowling leagues.
  - f. We have divorce recovery groups.
- C. How long do you hang in with a church that is not doing what it's supposed to do?
  - 1. Only God knows that.
  - 2. You are responsible to grow spiritually and you are accountable for your growth.
  - 3. If after some real wrestling over the direction of your church you may need to change.
- D. How do you handle children during your Flock times?
  - 1. Some of the kids are old enough to participate.
  - 2. Some need special attention.
- E. How do you change things that need to be addressed?
  - 1. Be prayerful.
  - 2. Don't give people more than they can handle.
  - 3. Churches can be difficult and people will get angry at you.
  - 4. Think through your concerns and pray and then be willing to be part of the solution.
- F. How do you recognize a false prophet in the church?
  - 1. I just did a series on false prophets. (Matthew 5:15-20)
  - 2. Listen to this and you will identify names.
