I. Introduction.

- A. Text: Romans 15:14.
- B. Some Christians leave a mark and others leave a blur.

II. The Christian who leaves a mark is full of goodness.

A. This is good character. (Mark 6:20)

B. Good character is costly. (Romans 5)

- 1. Tribulation makes for endurance.
- 2. Endurance makes for character.
- 3. God uses trials to bring us to maturity. (James 1 Peter 5:12)

C. We are to run the race, but it is no clear race—it is a conflict. (Hebrews 12:1, Ecclesiastes)

III. The Christian who leaves a mark is filled with all knowledge.

A. The Christian hero is one who has penetrated to ultimate reality—directly to God.

B. The Christian must have a first-hand knowledge of God.

C. The speaker came into a first-hand experience with God by admitting he was a sinner, believing that Jesus died on the cross for him and asking Him into his life.

IV. The Christian who leaves a mark is able to admonish.

A. This refers to an ability to give friendly advice.

B. Loving advice is lasting.
