Discipleship Part 2: Who Can Disciple? Tom Nelson

I. Review of Part 1.

- A. Five things are required to follow Jesus.
 - 1. Humility of self.
 - 2. Admiration of another.
 - 3. Education in the ways of God.
 - 4. Application of God's truth to our lives.
 - 5. Adoption into Jesus' purpose.
- B. Discipleship is giving up my will to do the will of God.

II. Discipleship is our priesthood.

- A. We do not come to God through a human mediator like the pope or any other leader but through Christ.
- B. The Protestant church protests the idea that a human mediator is necessary for us to hear from God.
- C. We believe in the direct communication between the believer and God.
- D. There is not a group of professional ministers to do the work of ministry but a body of believers that witness to the lost and win them to Christ.
 - 1. Paul ends his letter to Rome with a list of names; people who carried on the work of the ministry. (Romans 16)
 - 2. We have had revivals on the work of the Spirit, who Christ is, the inerrancy of the Word, etc., but there has never been a revival of applied ecclesiology.
 - a. The body does the work of ministry.
 - b. Often parachurch organizations do more in this area of ministry in the world than the church does, and it is not right.

E. Discipling

- 1. A discipler teaches the fundamentals of Christ.
- 2. A discipler gets your wheels on the track of truth, life, and ministry.

- 3. A discipler is an incarnation of Christ to you.
- F. What does it take to be a discipler? (Romans 2)
 - 1. Paul said they guide the blind, correct the foolish, and teach the babies. (Romans 2)
 - 2. Some Christians are still in basic training, never getting serious as a disciple.
- G. Discipleship is the logical outworking of a man or woman of God who desires to follow Christ.
- III. Nine things that mark a disciple of Christ.
 - A. Orthodoxy: you cannot lead people into error and be a disciple.
 - 1. It is inevitable that stumbling blocks will come but woe to those who promote them.
 - a. The Bible is inerrant.
 - b. Christ is the Son of God.
 - c. Salvation is an act of grace.
 - d. The Holy Spirit is deity.
 - e. The bodily resurrection of Christ and His second coming are certain.
 - 2. Elders must hold to the sound teaching of the Word (Titus 1:9)
 - 3. Get a book on systematic theology and study it.
 - B. A disciple maker has eternal values.
 - 1. We are not focused only on money and human appetites.
 - 2. We are focused on heavenly things.
 - 3. William Booth started the Salvation Army by focusing on others.
 - 4. "Am I my brother's keeper?" Yes.
 - 5. The one who lays up treasure on earth with no regard for heaven is a fool.
 - C. Incarnate truth in your life.
 - 1. The gospel does not come in word only but in power and conviction and the Holy Spirit living through men.
 - 2. How you speak to your mate and raise your kind is crucial to incarnating truth.
 - 3. The Pharisees were hypocrites, saying one thing and doing another.

- D. We must have a vital, personal, devotional life.
 - 1. Jesus often prayed early in the morning.
 - 2. We are not stagnant pool but flowing streams.
 - 3. Are you having daily personal time with God?
 - 4. If not then your teaching will be like mantras of what others teach.
 - 5. My greatest joy is to withdraw during the day, getting alone with God.

E. Communicate basic truths clearly.

- 1. You must be able to bet people started in truth such as the Bible is the Word of God, and Christ is the Son of God etc.
- 2. You must be able to help people see that dating, marriage, money, and time are issues of life that need to be in submission to God.
- F. You must enjoy people, not being prickly.
 - 1. We must be good listeners.
 - 2. We must be fun to be with.
 - 3. We must be liked by others as much as is possible.
 - 4. If we are exuding heartache and hardship we will not attract others.
- G. We need to have the ability to inspire.
 - 1. This is not a gift but the logical outworking of someone who loves God and people.
 - 2. Challenge people to obey Christ in light of who he is.
 - 3. What is the use of giving more truth to people who refuse to give it out to others?
 - 4. Bible teaching is not the purpose of the Christian life; it's the means to the Christian life.
 - 5. Instead of being privates we need to become corporals and sergeants.
 - 6. Trust God to help you to lead others.
 - 7. Do not go to church merely to sit and listen, but get involved in teaching others, mentoring them.
 - 8. We do not just give data but we inspire people.

- H. We must be able to reprove people when they need it.
 - 1. When people speak unkindly to their spouses we must be able to help them see this.
 - 2. We reprove in love, helping people to bring their conversation in line with God's standard.
- I. We need perseverance.
 - 1. Discipleship is not something we do for a season but for the rest of your life.
 - 2. Living for money and pleasure is empty.
 - 3. Living to help others to become followers of Christ brings fullness of life.
 - 4. This is fulfilling the mandate given to Adam, exercising dominion in the earth.

- B. Some of you are too busy making money and that is a shame.
- C. If you are just making money you are distracted with worthless things.
- D. God's will is for every Christian to disciple others.
