#### I. Introduction.

- A. Text: Acts 2:5-21.
- B. Setting: Pentecost.
- II. The tongues were intended for a certain group of people.
  - A. The multitude came together at the sound of a rushing wind.
  - B. The sound referred to the blast of wind that brought in all people from the entire city.
  - C. The people heard the disciples speak languages they would have been otherwise unable to speak.
  - D. The people gathered from the countries could hear them speaking in their native languages from the east, north, west and south.
  - E. They were speaking in different languages but speaking the same thing—they were praising God.

### III. The reaction of the people.

- A. The people were amazed (they blew their minds), they wondered (they sought for a solution), and they were perplexed (they had various thoughts running through their minds).
- B. Some inquired as to what it meant representing those with open minds.
- C. Others claimed that the group of disciples was drunk.

## IV. Peter's message.

- A. It was a simple explanation of reality.
- B. An explanation concerning the event.
  - 1. The disciples were not drunk on wine but the Holy Spirit. (Joel 2)
  - 2. Paul says to be filled with the Holy Spirit instead of being drunk on wine.
  - 3. The reason they could not be drunk is that it was early in the morning.
  - 4. The key to Joel's prophesy is that the Spirit would be poured out on all flesh.
  - 5. The emphasis of this section was that the good news would now go out to the Gentiles.

6. Joel's prophesy has yet to be fulfilled in a greater way when Jesus returns-	-prophesy
will be given instead of tongues and the moon will be blot out. (Matthew 24)	

- 7. The Spirit is given from the day of Pentecost on.
- 8. The marks of the biblical gift of tongues.
  - a. The gift of tongues is known languages.
  - b. They are addressed to God as praise.
  - c. The gift of tongues is intended to be manifest privately. (I Corinthians 12)
  - d. The biblical gift is a sign to unbelievers, not believers.
