- I. Introduction. Text: Colossians 3:1-11.
- II. In the midst of troubles the believer is to remember that Christ—his hidden resource—is always available to him.
 - A. Christ is in us—He makes the fullness of deity available to us now.
 - B. This is the announcement of Christian faith.
 - C. The believer is to remember this.
- III. The believer is to set his mind upon things above.
 - A. Paul is dealing in the realm of choices.
 - B. The believer is to choose to obey what God wants for him.
 - C. Remember who you are (in Christ), who you once were (the old godless self) and who you will be in the future.
 - 1. This is walking in the Spirit.
 - 2. The new man is to be put on and the old man is to be put off.
 - 3. Putting off refers to putting to death the old immoral way.
 - a. Sexual immorality.
 - b. Lusts.
 - c. Evil desires.
 - d. Greed for another person's body. This is idolatry.
 - 4. Reasons these things must be avoided.
 - a. The wrath of God keeps coming. The wrath of God is His judicial reaction to evil. (Romans 1)
 - b. To revert to these practices is to try to be who one no longer is. We must not do these things because we can choose to stop. (Romans 6:14)
 - 5. The believer must put off wrong attitudes as well.
 - a. Anger expressed in the wrong way through insult.

	E. There is no excuse—the believer is not what he was anymore because Christ is in him and he belongs to Him.
