- I. Introduction.
 - A. Text: II Timothy 4:9-22.
 - B. Paul expects Timothy to leave Ephesus and join him in Rome.
- II. The reason Paul requests Timothy is because Demas has forsaken him.
 - A. It is difficult to see a fellow believer fall back into the ways of the world.
 - B. Some suggest that Demas returned to the faith but there is little evidence.
 - C. This was a great heartbreak for Paul, and he says this with an extreme sense of loss.
- III. Luke and Titus are mentioned who doubtlessly helped Paul with his thorn in the flesh.
- IV. Paul requests Mark because he is helpful serving, showing he has forgiven him.
- V. Paul asks Timothy for more garments and above all the Scriptures for instruction.
- VI. Paul warns against Alexander the coppersmith who had done him wrong, but he reminds Timothy that vengeance is the Lords. (Romans 12)
- VII. The Lord stood by Paul to protect him from execution.
 - A. The Lord does not forsake. (Hebrews 13)
 - B. The presence of Jesus gave him courage to testify.
 - C. The Lord delivered Paul from beheading.

VIII. The foundation of life is the union of our spirit with the Lords to make us a new creation in Christ based on grace.
