## **God is Greater**

- I. Introduction. Text: I John 4:4-6.
- II. We are to test the spirits to see whether they are from God.
  - A. The test is that Jesus is the Christ.
  - B. It must be more than acknowledged—it must be confessed or lived by.
- III. Three distinct groups.
  - A. Little children who overcame the false teaching of their time.
    - 1. They overcame the false teaching by the greatness of God.
    - 2. Despite all appearances, God is incomparably greater than His enemies are.
    - 3. In these days of darkness, people need to lift up their eyes on high. (Isaiah 40)
    - 4. All this incomparable wisdom is available to the humblest believer.
    - 5. You do not have to understand all the wisdom and intelligence of God to understand it—trust it in childlike faith.
    - 6. It is necessary for man to examine things, but we must measure everything by the Word of God because man's thinking is blinded.
      - a. Only God has presented His credentials through resurrection—we are to accept the Word of God having come to Christ.
      - b. We must come to the Scriptures always with the attitude of a little child. (Proverbs 3:4-5)
  - B. The false teachers who listen to the world.
    - 1. They say what the world wants to hear.
    - 2. They are invariably popular.
    - 3. Everything they say is a basic assumption of the greatness of man.
    - 4. Man can have terrible intellectual pride in the face of appalling failure.
    - 5. The test is whether something glorifies man or God.
  - C. "We" refers to the Apostles.

- 1. They have the task of declaring authoritatively the task of God.
- 2. The Apostles watched Jesus and heard all that He did—they beheld His glory.
- 3. The test of truth and error is whether men receive the Apostolic testimony or not.
- IV. Testing spirits has nothing to do with how we treat people—it has to do with discerning what teaching to follow.
