- A. Text: I Corinthians 12, 14.
- B. The test of a counterfeit bill is simply to compare it to a genuine one.
- C. Genuine tongues must be examined to know if modern tongues are real.
- II. Characteristics of the true gift of tongues.
 - A. It is a human understandable language, not muttering.
 - B. It is spoken to God as praise and thanksgiving and not to man.
 - C. Tongues are a sign to unbelievers, not a private prayer language—no gift is to be practiced privately.
 - D. It is not to be used in a church meeting unless it is translated.
 - E. Women are not permitted to exercise the gift of tongues.
 - F. The gift of tongues is distributed by the sovereign choice of the Spirit, and not all speak in tongues—it is therefore not a unique sign of the baptism of the Spirit.
 - 1. The baptism of the Spirit takes place when a person becomes a Christian.
 - 2. There is no feeling attached to it, but it happens nonetheless.
 - 3. There is no Scripture that says tongues are a sign of the filling of the Spirit either.
