- I. Introduction.
- II. Ways to witness to one's family.
 - A. One of the best ways to witness to one's family is to ask for forgiveness for past wrongs or express gratefulness.
 - B. A believer should be prepared to discuss practical life issues with people from the Scriptures as an opportunity to witness. (I Corinthians 15, I Thessalonians 4)
 - C. Relationships are a great way to witness to others.
- III. We ought to be in relationships in the church where we can nurture each other in intimacy.
- IV. Man to man discipleship is essential for a healthy church.
 - A. A man must understand the gospel foremost.
 - B. Once one has received the gospel, he needs to understand his eternal security. (I John 2:25, 5:11-13, Romans 8:35-39)
 - C. The new believer needs to know about fellowship with God (I Corinthians 1:9, Mark 4:14), temptation (I Corinthians 10:13) and forgiveness from sins (I John 1:9).
 - D. He should be taught about Scripture memory and listening to sermons on tape.
 - E. There should be structured time and unstructured time.
- V. Witnessing at work.
 - A. Work can give a great opportunity for work. (Acts 17:17)
 - B. Work is ordained of God. (Genesis 2:15, 3:17-19)
 - C. Reasons to work.
 - 1. God wants us to work. (Ephesians 6:5-6)
 - 2. Our responsibility to our family is to work. (I Timothy 5:8)
 - 3. We need to keep from being a burden to others. (I Thessalonians 2:9, 3:8)
 - 4. We need to help meet the needs of others.
 - a. Those in ministry. (Acts 20:34)

- b. Those that are weak. (Acts 20:35)
- c. Those that are in need. (Ephesians 4:28)
- 5. We need to have a good testimony with non-Christians. (I Thessalonians 4:9, 12)
- 6. We need to be a good example before Christians. (II Thessalonians 3:9)
- 7. Laziness is forbidden in Scriptures. (II Thessalonians 3:10-12, Proverbs 13:4, 20:4, Romans 12:11, I Timothy 3)
- 8. Diligence is commended in Scripture. (Proverbs 22:29, 6:6-11, I Thessalonians 4:11)

D. Attitudes and actions.

- 1. One's attitude at work should not depend on one's boss or what one is doing. (Colossians 3:22, Ephesians 6:5)
- 2. Realize that you are serving God and not man. (Ephesians 6:5-7, Colossians 3:22-23)
- 3. Supervision should not have to do with how hard one works. (Colossians 3:22, Ephesians 6:6, Proverbs 6:6-11)
- 4. One should do his work hardily. (Colossians 3:23, Ephesians 6:6, Ecclesiastes 5:10, II Corinthians 8:11)
- 5. Be obedient to those in authority. (Colossians 3:23, Ephesians 6:5)
- 6. Realize that a job well done brings satisfaction. (Proverbs 13:19)
- 7. Little mundane tasks are not insignificant. (Luke 16:10-11)
- 8. Serving is work, and work is the only way one is going to become like Jesus. (Mark 10:45, II Corinthians 4:5)
- 9. Realize that your reward comes from God. (Ephesians 6:8, Colossians 3:24-25, Hebrews 6:10)
