 - 1. His life changed when Christ came into his life.
 - 2. He was a black man who hated white people.
 - 3. Now he wants to preach Christ to the world.
- C. Christ changes our destiny.
- I. Today I want to talk about the role of a disciple in the world today.
 - A. Prior to receiving Christ we were all separated from God, without hope. (Ephesians 2:11-13)
 - 1. People need hope and help.
 - 2. Without God self is in the center of our lives.
 - a. This produces selfish values.
 - b. When God comes into a person's life we become God centered.
 - c. This produces constructive behavior.
 - d. We are in the process of becoming more like Christ.
 - e. I met a couple lately who lost their baby and said God is unfair.
 - f. The truth is they don't know God and are without hope or help.
 - B. God is building within believers a holy temple for himself that we might be his peculiar people. (1 Peter 2:9-11)
 - 1. Believers are salt and light in this world. (Matthew 5:13-14)
 - a. God's people are to be different from the world.

- b. God has called his children to be holy.
- c. Israel was to be different from their neighbors. (Leviticus 18)
 - 1. A black man in South Africa crashed into a white Christian's car and the Christian befriended the man.
 - 2. He invited this black man to his home to talk and he shared Christ with him.
- d. I wonder what my neighbors would say about me.
 - 1. Would they say we are Bible busy?
 - 2. Would they say we are loving and caring.
- 2. Believers are to penetrate the world with preserving quality.
 - a. Jesus prayed that believers should be in the world. (John 17)
 - b. A friend wanted to leave his job because his coworkers were all unbelievers.
 - c. An excited evangelist calls unbelievers pre-Christians.
 - d. Jesus became incarnate into the human condition. (John 1:14)
 - e. A friend planned to spend time with non-Christians in order to love them.
 - f. Our world is post-Christian.
 - g. After five years my friend and his wife have seen five couples come to Christ.
 - h. The Welsh revival over 100 years ago swept that country,
 - 1. Pubs closed
 - 2. Crime dropped.
 - 3. The coal mines ceased production because the mules in the mines that pulled the coal did not know how to respond to the workers' kind words.

 - 5. Divorce dropped.

- 2. Divorce is skyrocketing.

- j. If a house is dark is it the house's fault?
- k. Society is not to blame because it needs salt and light.
- 1. Where are God's people?
- m. We need to make some changes in our lives by taking on a new identity.
 - 1. Psychologists tell us there are three needs; security, significance, and satisfaction.
 - 2. We need these things but the world tries to find these in belonging to someone or something like gangs or clubs
 - 3. We fear rejection.
 - 4. Christians belong to God, he is our father. (Romans 8:15-17)
 - 5. We are the precious possessions of God. (Psalm 103:10)
 - 6. I confessed once to my dad something I had done wrong and he told me not to do it again.
 - 7. God knows we are not perfect and his forgiveness is endless.
 - 8. As long as we continue coming to God with our sins he continues to forgive us.
 - 9. We have appearance needs and success needs, etc.
 - 10. Self worth is an identity issue that only becomes real by seeing ourselves in Christ.
 - 11. We are no longer slaves but we are friends of God. (John 15:13-15)
 - 12. Accomplishment and possessions do not make people significant.
 - 13. Self-fulfillment will not satisfy us. (Philippians 4:19)
 - 14. Our confidence is from God. (2 Corinthians 3: 6)
 - 15. Jesus lived to please his Father. (John 8:39)
