- A. I want to speak of leaving a spiritual heir.
- B. This is crucial in the area of leaving a legacy.
- C. We live on the basis of God's promises to us, not our promises to God.
- D. My family is claiming Judges 6:16 this year in light of the challenges we have

- I. Why leave a spiritual heir?
 - A. The speaker reads the text. (Judges 2:6-19)
 - 1. Israel failed to take the land and God refused to drive out their enemies.
 - 2. Israel turned to idols.
 - 3. God would send an oppressor and Israel would cry out.
 - 4. Then God would send a deliverer to save Israel but they later turned again to sin.
 - B. The ignorance of the generation that came after Joshua took the land is disturbing.
 - 1. They did not know the person of the Lord.
 - 2. They didn't even know what God had done for them.
 - 3. Redemptive history is crucial to knowing the Lord.
 - 4. Idolatry fills the void when knowledge of God prevails.
 - 5. I try to help my daughter to see that even non-Christians have a faith, though it is not based on truth.
 - C. After ignorance of the Lord came defeat in Israel as God was against them.

- 1. This downward spiral goes on around us all the time.
- 2. The reason for this problem is rooted in the ignorance of the new generation. (verse 10)
- 3. How could they have failed to pass on their faith to the next generation?
 - a. The book of Joshua is a book of victory following the death of Moses.
 - b. The book of Judges is a book of defeat following the death of Joshua.
 - c. When men and women of God fail to leave spiritual heirs defeat follows.
- 4. How does this situation turn around?
 - a. After Judges comes the kingdom under David.
 - b. Two women turn the nation around; Ruth and Hannah.
 - c. There is no genealogy in Judges but with Ruth a significant genealogy leads to David.
 - d. We know the story of Ruth because someone wrote the story, probably in the time of David.
 - e. Ruth must have passed on the experiences of her life.
 - f. Hannah cried out for a spiritual heir and must have told her story to Samuel or someone close who could write it down.
 - g. These two women were not full-time workers for God but they walked with him in the ordinary circumstances of life.

II. How do we leave a spiritual heir?

- A. Clarifying our legacy is important first of all. (Ecclesiastes 12:9-12)
 - 1. The teacher was wise and he passed his knowledge on to others.
 - 2. Many of us here have years of wisdom that needs to be passed on to others.
 - 3. The teacher searched out words to communicate what God taught him.
 - 4. Mary pondered the things Gabriel told her (Luke 2)
 - 5. We need to clarify the things God has taught us.
 - 6. Don't let the years go by without identifying the key lessons God has taught you.
 - 7. Words of the wise are like goads that drive animals.

- 8. There needs to be a point to our words.
- 9. These words are given by one shepherd;
 - a. They need to be Christ centered.
 - b. They need to be simple.
- B. Investing in a person is important.
 - 1. Jesus trained the twelve.
 - 2. Paul trained Timothy and Titus.
 - a. Choices need to be made; Paul chose to focus on Titus. (2 Corinthians 2:12-13)
 - b. Choosing means that some great opportunities will not be taken.
 - c. We need to think of how many apples are in a seed.
 - d. If the right opportunities are nurtured great harvests can be gained form one seed or person.
 - b. Paul had a vision for what God could do through Titus. (2 Corinthians 7:5-7)
 - f. We have a responsibility to develop potential in people. (2 Timothy 2:2)
 - g. We need to invest our time in the right people.
 - h. Paul saw God do a miracle in Titus' heart. (2 Corinthians 8:16-17)
 - i. Paul played a part but God did the work.
 - ii. We need to play a part in the lives of our spiritual heirs.
 - e. Paul transmitted something to Titus. (2 Corinthians 12:18)
 - a. Titus exhibited the same spirit as Paul.
 - b. In Paul's absence Titus ministered.
 - c. What needs to happen in your disciples before they will imitate you?
 - d. I am interested in tracing those who went before me that paid a price to pass on a spiritual legacy to me.
 - 3. We all need to run the race God has placed us in and we need to leave a spiritual heir.
