 - E. To deny is to seek first the kingdom of God. Jesus wants to be first. (Matthew 6, Proverbs 16:2
 - F. Our natural mind is depraved. (Genesis 6:5, Proverbs 14:12)
 - G. Either Christ is Lord or we are Lord. (John 12:24)
 - H. We have to put the cross to that particular thing in our life that needs killing.
 - I. The burden of the Lord is not necessarily burdensome. (2 Corinthians 12:9)
